

4. Procedure for Enforcement of this Ordinance.
 - a. Schedule of Deposits. Deposits shall be made in cash, money orders, or certified check to the Clerk of Door County Circuit Court or the Sheriff of Door County who shall provide a receipt therefore. And the amount of the bond schedule is hereto fixed at \$100.00 plus surcharges or such amount that the Circuit Court of Door County hereafter affixes.
 - b. Adoption of this ordinance does not preclude the County Board from adopting any other ordinance or providing for the enforcement of any other law or ordinance relating to the same or other matter. And issuance of a citation hereunder shall not preclude the county or any authorized officer from proceeding under any other ordinance or law or by any other enforcement method to enforce any ordinance, regulation or order.
 - c. All ordinances or parts of ordinances contravening the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. (Ord. #27-86; 3/25/86)

31.18 BURNING AND FIREWORKS

1. **Outside Burning.** It shall be unlawful for any person, organization, business, or corporation to light or maintain any outside fires unless a permit has been issued by the Town Chairman, Village President, Fire Chief or a designee of said official, except for:
 - a. Cooking purposes; and
 - b. Camp Fires; and
 - c. Burning barrel, with a metal screen top, under direct supervision, with an extinguishment source.
2. **Fireworks.** It shall be unlawful for any person, organization, business, or corporation to light or maintain any illegal fireworks, except fireworks for public display in compliance with state law shall be permitted after obtaining all state and local permits.
3. **Training Exceptions.** The Fire Department may, however, in its usual training courses, either exclusively by the department or in conjunction with other industries or businesses, burn such substances as is deemed appropriate by said department for the purpose of training either members of the Fire Department, or persons employed by industry or business.
4. **Enforcement.**
 - a. Prosecutions under this chapter shall be made by the issuance of county ordinance citations and the procedure to be followed shall be governed by those Wisconsin Statutes pertinent and applicable to chapter violations.
 - b. All Door County law enforcement officials are hereby authorized in the name of the County of Door to make arrests or issue citations for prosecution for violations occurring under this chapter.

Special Drought Section

- 1. **Outside Burning.** It shall be unlawful for any person, organization, business, or corporation to light or maintain any outside fires including but not limited to brush, grass, bonfire, campfire, burning barrel, or cage except for:
 - a. Cooking purposes, and maintained on a non-combustible surface.
- 2. **Fireworks.** It shall be unlawful for any person, organization, business, or corporation to light or maintain any fireworks that produce an open flame or spark except for public display, which must be displayed over water, wind permitting, in compliance with state law and after obtaining all state and local permits, which must be issued by the Town Chairman, Village President, or a designee of said official.

This section can be implemented when it has been determined that a drought exists, by the Emergency Services Director, and will be in effect until rescinded by the Director.

5. **Penalties, Forfeitures**

- a. Any person found guilty of violating this chapter or any part of this chapter shall be subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500.00 together with the costs of prosecution and in rueful default of payment of such forfeiture and cost of prosecution, shall be imprisoned in the county jail until said forfeiture is paid, but not exceeding 30 days.
- b. Any person found guilty of violating this chapter or any part of this chapter shall be subject to all charges for the extinguishment of said fire by all agencies involved with extinguishment of said fire.
- c. Any person found guilty of violating this chapter or any part of this chapter shall be subject to full payment for all losses that said fire may have caused.
- d. Any person, organization, business, or corporation, violating any of the subsections of this chapter may stipulate to guilt or no contest and may pay to the arresting official or to the Clerk of Court a bond of \$125.00. Such stipulation will make it unnecessary for the subject charged to appear in court, and will act as a basis for court to enter judgement and order forfeiture of the bond. Forfeitures, penalty assessments, costs and fees shall be disbursed as provided in Wisconsin Statutes, Section 66.12.
- e. Bond deposits shall be made in cash, money orders, certified check, or Master Charge or Visa. The arresting official or Clerk of Court shall provide a receipt therefore.
